Course Description

Legislation and risk management are topics of importance to the recreation profession.

Students will examine the legal process and review numerous case studies relating to liability and negligence issues.

Students will conduct research and present information pertaining to provincial statutes affecting recreation.

- 1.6 Recognize the need to meet legal responsibilities and to consult with legal counsel on matters requiring legal clarification or interpretation.
- 1.7 Identify the steps to develop a risk management program.
- 1.8 Provide examples of informed consent, insurance, liability, and risk management.

2. Analyze the implications of provincial legislation affecting recreation.

- 2.1 Access relevant provincial statutes pertaining to recreation.
- 2.2 Explain the content and effect specific statutes have on recreation.
